If you have a travel request for your scout (i.e. travelling with a particular person or not travelling with a particular person), please let the Scoutmaster know.

If you send your scout with money to spend and are concerned that he might lose it, put it in a zip lock bag with a piece of paper inside with his name and the amount on it. He can come and get his money as needed. Scouts should not have expensive items at camp that may get lost or broken.

Scouts that have concerns of any kind need to convey them to the Scoutmaster. As a parent, you may ask another parent to be responsible for your scout's medications or money. The Scoutmaster still needs to know this information in case there is a problem. All information will be kept confidential.
